First Sea Sortie of Fifth Scorpene Submarine 'Vagir'

- The fifth submarine of Project 75, Yard 11879, Indian Navy's Kalvari class commenced her sea trials on 01 Feb 22. The submarine was launched in Nov 2020 from the Kanhoji Angre Wet Basin of Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL). The submarine would be named Vagir, after commissioning.
- MDL has 'Delivered' two submarines of the Project 75 in the year 2021 and the commencement of sea trials of the fifth submarine is a significant milestone.
- The submarine will now undergo intense trials of all its systems at sea, including propulsion systems, weapons, and sensors. The submarine is scheduled for delivery to the Indian Navy in the year 2022 after the completion of these trials.

Project 75 India:

- This project envisages indigenous construction of submarines equipped with the state-of-the-art Air Independent Propulsion system at an estimated cost of Rs. 43,000 crores.
- Project 75 (I), approved in 2007, is part of the Indian Navy's 30-year Plan for indigenous submarine construction.
- P75I succeeded the P75 under which six diesel-electric attack submarines of the Kalvari class, based on the Scorpene-class, were being built at MDL (Mazagon Dock Limited) – the third submarine, INS Karanj, was commissioned in March 2021.
- Of the total 24 submarines to be built in India, six will be nuclear-powered.
- Other four submarines are:

About the Exercise Milan 2022:

- It is a biennial, multilateral naval exercise that started in 1995.
- The areas of cooperation of the exercise includes capacity building, marine domain awareness, training, hydrography, technical assistance, and operational exercises.



India-EU Calls for Resolution of Indo-Pacific Disputes

- Amid China's aggression in the South China Sea the EU has joined hands to call a free, open, inclusive & rules-based maritime order in the Indo-Pacific region.
- They have called for a peaceful resolution of disputes in accordance with the United Nations Convention on Law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

South China Sea Dispute:

- China lays claim to nearly all of the South China Sea, including the Paracel Islands.
- However, Taiwan, the Philippines, Brunei, Malaysia & Vietnam also claim parts of the region, believed to hold valuable oil and gas deposits.

South China Sea Dispute-Location

- South China Sea is an arm of the western Pacific Ocean in Southeast Asia.
- Bordering states China, Republic of China (Taiwan), Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, Indonesia, Singapore & Vietnam.

Brahmos, Uran Missiles Successfully Test Fired from the Andaman Islands

- India conducted two successful anti-ship missile tests from the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- The latest test-fire comes just a week after the BrahMos supersonic cruise missile was fired off the coast of Odisha in Balasore on January 20.
- The BrahMos supersonic cruise missile can cover a range of 290 km, reaching the Mach 2.8 to 3 Mach speed.
- Meanwhile, the BrahMos II Hypersonic cruise missile can be deployed to hit the target within a range of 450 – 600 km in a Mach 7 velocity.

Andaman and Nicobar Command (ANC):

• It is the first and only Tri-Service theatre command of the Indian Armed Forces, based at Port Blair in Andaman and Nicobar Islands of India.
