39th Commanders' Conference of ICG

- Rajnath Singh inaugurated the three-day 39th Commanders' Conference of the ICG in New Delhi on May 30, 2022. Defence Secretary Dr. Ajay Kumar, DG ICG Shri VS Pathania, and other senior officials of the Ministry of Defence and the ICG were present on the occasion.
- The Raksha Mantri stressed the need to maintain maritime preparedness in the
 constantly-changing global scenario, terming it as a crucial aspect that
 safeguards the economic and strategic interests of a nation. He pointed out that
 there has been a shift in India's maritime security needs due to the everevolving global situation.
- The Raksha Mantri emphasised that the role of the ICG is not only limited to coastal areas, describing them as the protectors of India's national interests and sovereign rights in the territorial seas and Exclusive Economic Zone. "There have been no reports of any breach in coastal security in the last 14 years due to the ICG's dynamic strategy and its cooperation with the Indian Navy &local administration," he said. Shri Rajnath Singh added that Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision of SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region) is based on the spirit of friendship, openness, dialogue, co-existence with the neighbours. It is our main responsibility which is being fulfilled by the ICG successfully, he said.

- the deadly components of the tobacco and its ill effects and to encourage people to claim their right to health and healthy living and to protect future generations.
- With the strength of more than 15 lakh cadets, National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the largest uniformed and disciplined youth organisation in the world and undertakes extensive social awareness campaigns as part of its contribution to the Society.



MoD signs over Rs 2,900 crore contract with BDL for procurement of ASTRA Mk I

- In a major boost to PM Shri Narendra Modi's vision of 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat',
 MOD, on May 31, 2022, signed a contract with BDL for the supply of ASTRA MK I BVR AAM and associated equipment for the Indian Air Force & Indian Navy at a
 cost of Rs 2,971 crore under Buy category.
- Till now, the technology to manufacture missile of this class indigenously was
 not available. ASTRA MK-I BVR AAM has been Indigenously Designed &
 Developed by Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) based
 on the Staff Requirements issued by the Indian Air Force (IAF) catering for
 Beyond Visual Range as well as Close Combat Engagement reducing the
 dependency on foreign sources. Air to Air missile with BVR capability provides
 large Stand Off Ranges to own fighter aircraft which can neutralise the adversary
 aircraft without exposing itself to adversary Air Defence measures, thereby

gaining & sustaining superiority of the Air Space. This missile is technologically and economically superior to many such imported missile systems.



India, China Agree To Hold Next Round Of Military Talks Soon

- India and China on Tuesday decided to hold the next (16th) round of the senior commanders meeting at an early date to achieve the objective of complete disengagement from all friction points along the LAC in the Western Sector.
- The 24th meeting of the Working Mechanism for Consultation & Coordination on India-China Border Affairs (WMCC) was held on Tuesday where the two sides reviewed the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the western sector of India-China border areas.
- The previous meeting under the framework of the WMCC had taken place in November while the 15th round of military dialogue was held on March 11.
- India has been consistently maintaining that peace and tranquillity along the LAC were key for the overall development of the bilateral ties.
- Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60,000 troops along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the sensitive sector.
