Projects Worth Rs 6100 Crore At Hanamkonda

- PM Modi Laid The Foundation Stone Of Several Infrastructure Projects Worth Over 6100 Crore Rupees At Hanamkonda In Telangana.

- Stating That Infrastructure Development Gained Pace During The Past Nine Years, Mr. Modi Said Many Such Projects Are Passing Through Telangana. He Reiterated That The Central Government Is Committed To The Development Of All States.
- Union Road Transport And Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari Said The Highway Projects For Which Foundation Was Laid Today Will Help Develop Backward Regions Of The State And Also Improve Connectivity, Especially Of Industrial Corridors And SEZs.



Projects Worth Rs 24,300 Crore In Rajasthan

Alliance Air Makes Significant Strides


- Alliance Air, A Subsidiary Of Air India, Is Making Significant Strides In Improving Connectivity Between India And Sri Lanka.
- After Successfully Restarting Flights Between Jaffna's Palaly Airport And Chennai In December 2022, Alliance Air Will Launch Daily Flights Between Jaffna International Airport And Chennai From The 16th Of July, Becoming The First Airline To Do So.
- Till June, The Airline Has Handled Over 12,000 Passengers With Over A Hundred Flights Between The Two Cities.
- Previously Operating Four Flights Per Week, Alliance Air's Decision To Increase The Frequency Of Daily Flights Reflects The Growing Demand For Travel Between The Two Destinations.
- Additionally, The Airline Has Plans To Introduce Another Domestic Air Connection Between Jaffna And Ratmalana By Adding It To Their Radar Soon.

- United Kingdom National Security Adviser Tim Barrow On 7th July 2023, Friday Met National Security Adviser Ajit Doval In New Delhi. The Two Sides Discussed Regional And Global Issues Of Mutual Interest.

- They Also Affirmed That There Can Be No Justification For Violent Extremism And Radicalization In A Democracy.




Russia And Ukraine Urged Not To Use Cluster Munitions

- Human Rights Groups Urged Russia And Ukraine Not To Use Cluster Munitions And Asked The US Not To Supply Them To Kyiv.
- In A Statement, The Office Of The United Nations High Commissioner For Human Rights Once Again Called On Both Countries Not To Use The Controversial Weapons, Cluster Munitions As They Pose An Immense Danger To Civilians.
- Earlier, The Us Confirmed The Decision To Provide Kyiv With The Controversial Weapons As Part Of A New Military Aid Package.
- US National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan Said That The Decision Follows Months Of Debate Within The Biden Administration About Whether To Provide Kyiv With The Controversial Weapons Banned By Over 100 Countries Including Key US Allies.
- Ukraine Has Been Asking For The Weapons For Months Amid An Ammunition Shortage.



BSF Commander Who Joined Bangladesh Freedom Dies

- Legendary Commander Of Border Security Force (BSF) Parimal Kumar Gosh, Who Reportedly Was The First Indian Military Officer To Help Bangladesh Freedom Fighters In 1971, Breathed His Last On Thursday In New Delhi.
- He Was 84. PK Ghosh Was Suffering From Cancer, Say Media Reports In Bangladesh.
- In Bangladesh, People Consider Him One Of The Legendary Indian Commanders Who Fought For The Cause Of Bangladesh And People Also Believe That He Was Instrumental In The Initial Formation Of Mukti Vahini. Ghosh Was One Of The Commanders Of The 92nd Battalion Of BSF And Was Posted In Tripura At The Onset Of The Freedom Movement Of Bangladesh.
- He Had Told Earlier That He Was Emotionally Moved By The Tales Of Torture And Terror Unleashed By The Pakistani Forces On Bengali People In March 1971.
