

296 Reported Dead As Powerful Earthquake Hits Morocco

Why In The News?

 A Powerful Earthquake With A Preliminary Magnitude Of 6.8 Has Hit Morocco, Killing At Least 296 People, Injuring More Than 150, Damaging Buildings And Sending Local People Fleeing Into The Streets For Safety. Reported Number Of Dead And Injured Was A Preliminary Figure.



At least 296 reported dead as powerful earthquake hits Morocco

The earthquake struck late Friday evening, with the epicentre 75 kilometres west of Marrekesh, a major economic centre.

What Do We Know?

- The Interior Ministry Said Authorities Have "Mobilized All The Necessary Resources To Intervene And Help The Affected Areas". Hospitals In Marrakesh Reportedly Saw A **"Massive Influx" Of Injured People.**
- The Regional Blood Transfusion Centre In Marrakesh Has Called On Residents To Donate Blood For Those Injured. The Quake Struck 71 Kilometres Southwest Of Tourist Hotspot Marrakesh At A Depth Of 18.5 Kilometres At 11:11 PM, The US Geological Survey Said.
- USGS's PAGER System, Which Provides Preliminary Assessments On The Impact Of Earthquakes, Issued An Orange Alert For Economic Losses, Estimating Significant Damage Is Likely. Past Events With This Alert Level Have Required A Regional Or National-level Response, According To The US Government Agency.
- The Population In This Region Lives In Structures That Are **Highly Vulnerable To Earthquake Shaking.** Internet Connectivity Was Disrupted In Marrakesh Due To

Power Cuts, According To Global Internet Monitor Netblocks. Moroccan Media Reported It Was The **Most Powerful Earthquake To Hit The Country To Date.**
