

Kilauea Volcano On Hawaii's

- US Geological Survey (USGS) Said That Kilauea Volcano On Hawaii's Big Island Began To Erupt On Sunday With Flows Currently Confined To The Surrounding Crater Floor.
- Webcam Images Show Fissures At The Base Of The Volcano's Crater That Are Generating Lava Flows On The Surface Of The Crater Floor.
- The Hawaii Emergency Management Agency Said That The Eruption Does Not Pose A Lava Threat To Communities Though Volcanic Particles And Gases May Create Breathing Problems For People Exposed.
- The USGS Said, The Eruption Was Preceded By A Period Of Strong Seismicity And Rapid Uplift Of The Summit.

- Located In A Closed Area Of Hawaii Volcanoes National Park
- Kilauea Is One Of The World's Most Active Volcanoes. In 2019, A String Of Earthquakes And Major Eruption At Kilauea Led To The Destruction Of Hundreds Of Homes And Businesses.

- Manjapra Is Shortlisted For 'Black Ghost Of Empire: The Long Death Of Slavery And The Failure Of Emancipation'.
- The Winner Of The Prize Of 25,000 Pound Will Be Announced At An Awards Ceremony In London On October 31. Each Of The Shortlisted Writers Will Receive A 1,000 Pound Each.

'Tourism for Tomorrow'



Libya 2000 People Feared Dead Due To Heavy Flooding

- In Libya, At Least 2000 People Are Feared Dead And Thousands More Missing Due To Heavy Flooding.
- The Flood Caused By Storm Daniel, Swept Away Entire Neighbourhoods In Eastern Libya And Wrecked Homes In Multiple Coastal Towns.
- Derna In Eastern Libya, Is Said To Be The Worst Affected City And Has Become Inaccessible.
- Two Dams In Derna, Have Reportedly Collapsed, Submerging Much Of The Area And Drowning Some Residents.
- Storm Daniel Which Struck Greece, Turkey, And Bulgaria Last Week Swept In Over The Mediterranean.
- The Storm Is Also Expected To Arrive In Parts Of West Egypt Where The Meteorological Authorities Have Warned About Possible Rain And Bad Weather.
- According To Climate Scientists, Global Warming Is The Major Cause Behind This. They Have Warned That More Water Evaporating During The Summer Is Leading To More Intense Storms.



Biggest Military Exercise Since The Cold War

- The NATO Countries Are Planning To Hold The Biggest Military Exercise Since The Cold War.
- It Is Expected To Involve Between 500 And 700 Air Combat Missions, More Than 50 Ships, And About 41,000 Troops.
- The Exercise Is Designed To Model Potential Manoeuvres Against An Enemy Modelled On A Coalition Led By Russia, Named Occasus For The Purposes Of The Drill.
- It Is To Practice Repelling A Russian Attack Against A Member Of The Alliance.
- The "Steadfast Defender" Exercises Is Part Of NATO's Push To Transform From Crisis Response To A War-Fighting Alliance.
- The Drills Will Be Carried Out On The Territory Of Germany, Poland, And The Baltic Countries. Sweden, Whose Full Accession To NATO Is Yet To Be Approved, Is Expected To Join The Drills. Bringing The Total Number Of Nations Involved To 32.
