
'Namaste From Bharat' To 'India That Is Bharat': S. Jaishankar UNGA Address

Why In News

And Extremism" In Canada, Raising Concerns Over Them Being "Very Permissive" Due To Political Reasons.



- He Further Stressed That The Indian Government Has Provided The Canadian Side With A Lot Of Information About The Crime, And There Has Been A Large Number Of Extradition Requests.
- Raised Concern Over These Incidents Of Threats To Indian Diplomats And Attacks On Indian Consulates.
- Regarding PM Trudeau's Allegations, Jaishankar Assured That The Indian Side Will Take Action If The Canadian Side Provides Specific Information In Connection With Khalistani Leader Hardeep Nijjar's Killing.

- Jaishankar In His Address Said, "We Often Advocate The Promotion Of A Rules-Based Order. From Time To Time, Respect For The UN Charter Is Also Invoked.
 But For All The Talk, It Is Still A Few Nations Who Shape The Agenda And Seek To Define The Norms. This Cannot Go On Indefinitely. Nor Will It Go Unchallenged.
- He Asserted That A "Fair, Equitable And Democratic Order" Will Surely Emerge, "Once We All Put Our Minds To It.
- India Has Entered The 'Amrit Kaal' The World Saw A Glimpse Of What Is To Come When Our Chandrayaan-3 Landed On The Moon. Message To The World Is In Digitally Enabled Governance And Delivery In The Widening Ambit Of Amenities And Services And Rapidly Growing Infra And In Our Energetic Start-Up Structure.
