- Notably, The Directorate General Of GST Intelligence (DGGI) Has Issued Preshow Cause Notices To 12 Online Gaming Companies Worth ₹ 55,000 Crore.
 Dream11, The Gaming Unicorn, Has Received The Largest Tax Notice For Dues Worth ₹ 25,000 Crore.
- The Notices Were Issued After The Recent Change In GST Rates For Real Money Games Increased The Levy To 28% On The Total Bet Placed At Entry Level Of Each Gaming Session On RMG Platforms.
