Why In News

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi Is Expected To Inaugurate **The First Phase Of India International Convention Centre (IICC)**, Named **Yashobhoomi In Dwarka**, On His Birthday On Sunday.
- He Is Also Likely To Dedicate The Extension Of Delhi Airport Metro Express Line From Dwarka Sector 21 To A New Metro Station At Dwarka Sector 25.
- Noting That It Is Modi's Vision Of Having A **World Class Infrastructure** For Hosting Meetings, Conferences And Exhibitions In The Country, Officials Said The Operationalisation Of Yashobhoomi At Dwarka Will Be A Big Boost To The Exercise.

- Yashobhoomi Will Find Its Place Among The **World's Largest MICE Facilities**.
- With A Total Project Area Of Over **8.9 Lakh Square Meters** And A Total Built-Up Area Of More Than **1.8 Lakh Square Metres**.
- MICE Stands For Meetings, Incentives, Conferences, And Exhibitions.

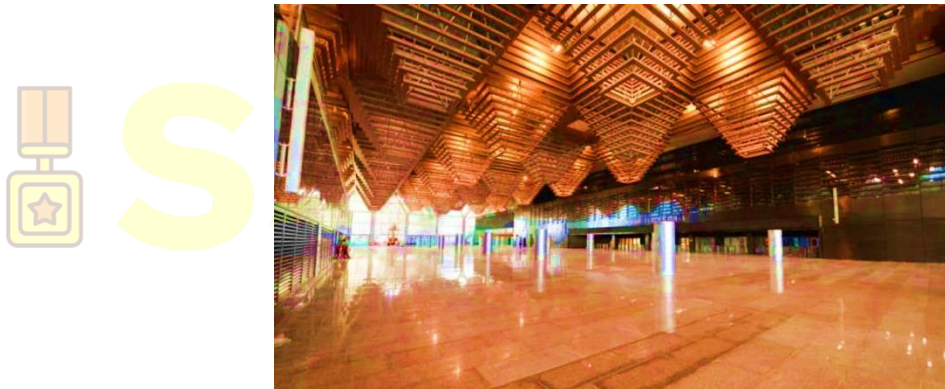
Largest LED Media Facade

- The Convention Centre, Built Across More Than 73,000 Sq M Of Area, Comprises **15 Convention Rooms** Including The Main Auditorium, The Grand Ballroom And **13 Meeting Rooms** With A Total Capacity Of Holding 11,000 Delegates. It Has The **Largest LED Media Facade** In The Country.
- The Main Auditorium Is The Plenary Hall For The Convention Centre And Is Equipped With A Seating Capacity Of Around 6,000 Guests.



Largest Exhibition Halls In The World

- Yashobhoomi Also Offers One Of The **Largest Exhibition Halls In The World**.
- It Consists Of Materials And Objects Inspired From Indian Culture In The Form Of **Terrazzo Floors** With Brass Inlay Representing Rangolis Patterns, Suspended Sound Absorbent Metal Cylinders, Lit Up Patterned Walls.



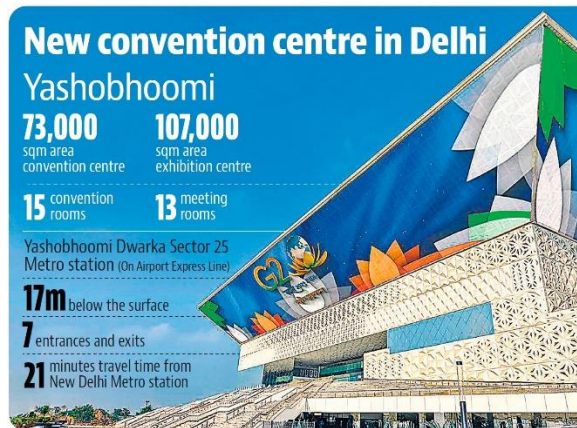
Commitment To Sustainability

- Its Campus Has Received **Green Cities Platinum Certification** From CII's Indian Green Building Council (IGBC).



Unique Grand Foyer Space

- The Grand Foyer, Connected To The Exhibition Halls, Showcases A Distinctive **Copper Ceiling** That Filters Light Through Various Skylights.
- It Will House Essential Support Areas Such As Media Rooms, VVIP Lounges, Cloak Facilities, Visitor Information Centers, Ticketing, And More.



Inauguration Of The New Metro Station

- It Will Also Be Connected To The Delhi Airport Metro Express Line With The Inauguration Of The New Metro Station At Dwarka Sector 25.
- Delhi Metro Will Also Increase The Operational Speed Of Metro Trains On Airport Express Line From 90 Km/Hr To 120 Km/Hr Reducing The Travel Time.
- The Total Journey From New Delhi To Yashobhoomi Dwarka Sector 25 Will Take About 21 Minutes.
