76th Session Of WHO Regional Committee



- These cities are lauded for their innovative approaches to urban planning, which prioritize the well-being of their citizens.
- With the addition of Kozhikode and Gwalior, the network now encompasses 350 creative cities across more than 100 countries, encompassing seven distinct

creative fields: Crafts and Folk Art, Design, Film, Gastronomy, Literature, Media Arts, and Music.



India Assisted Development Projects In Bangladesh

- Prime Minister said, since 2020, parcel and container trains are also running between India and Bangladesh. The world's biggest cruise, **Ganga Vilas**, between India and Bangladesh, tourism has been boosted.
- In her address, Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina said, there is firm friendship between India and Bangladesh. She paid homage to sacrifice of people of India during 1971 war of Liberation.

- Additionally, the implementation of the WPA3 standard bolsters network security, ensuring the safeguarding of user data.



Annual Report On Road Accidents In India

- The **Ministry of Road Transport and Highways** has recently unveiled its "Road Accidents in India-2022" Annual Report.
- The report reveals a worrisome surge in road accidents in India during the calendar year 2022, emphasizing the need for comprehensive measures to address this growing crisis.
- According to the report, a staggering total of **4,61,312 road accidents** were reported across various States and Union Territories in India during 2022.
- These accidents resulted in a tragic loss of 1,68,491 lives and caused injuries to 4,43,366 individuals. The figures **represent a distressing increase** of 11.9% in accidents, 9.4% in fatalities, and 15.3% in injuries when compared to the previous year.



"One Nation, One Registration Platform"

- The **National Medical Commission** (NMC) has initiated a mission to allocate a **distinctive identification number** to every physician in the country by the conclusion of 2024.
- Central to this endeavor is the establishment of the National Medical Register (NMR), which will function as a centralized repository for all practicing doctors in India.
- This step is anticipated to streamline the healthcare sector and bolster transparency.

- A trial run for the **National Medical Register** (NMR) is scheduled for launch within the next six months, with the complete implementation set for completion by the end of 2024.
- Dr. Yogendra Malik, a member of the Ethics and Medical Registration Board of the NMC, shed light on this ambitious project.
- The NMR will supersede the current Indian Medical Register (IMR) and will be publicly accessible through the NMC's official website.
- It will provide comprehensive information about registered doctors, including:
- Unique Identification Number (UID): Each doctor will receive a unique identification number.
- **Registration Number**: The doctor's registration number for verification.
- Name and Place of Work: Details concerning the doctor's identity and workplace.
- Qualifications: Information pertaining to the doctor's educational credentials.
- **Specialization**: The doctor's field of expertise.
- Institute/University: The name of the institution or university where the qualifications were obtained.





Rohini Nayyar Prize

- In a significant acknowledgment of his remarkable efforts, **Deenanath Rajput**, an engineer-turned-social worker, was awarded the **Second Rohini Nayyar Prize** for his outstanding contribution to rural development.
- The prestigious award was presented in memory of the late economistadministrator Dr. Rohini Nayyar, and it came with a trophy, a citation, and a cash prize of Rs 10 lakh.

- Empowering Tribal Women in Bastar, Chhattisgarh. Deenanath Rajput's commendable work focuses on empowering tribal women in Bastar, Chhattisgarh, a region known for its challenges, including Naxalite activities.
- His efforts have been instrumental in positively transforming the lives of over 6,000 tribal women in the area.



Nandini Das Winner British Academy Book Prize 2023

- India-born author Nandini Das has been named the winner of the 2023 British
 Academy Book Prize for Global Cultural Understanding, a leading international
 non-fiction prize, for her book 'Courting India: England, Mughal India and the
 Origins of Empire'. Das is a Professor of English literatre at the University of
 Oxford.
- The winning book is her debut and has been described by critics as the "true origin story of Britain and India told through England's first diplomatic mission to the Mughal courts".
- The author has sought to present a new perspective on the origins of empire through the story of the arrival of the first English ambassador in India, Sir Thomas Roe, in the early 17th century.



1st Australia India Education And Skill Council Meeting

- The First Australia India Education and Skill Council meeting will be held at IIT
 Gandhinagar in Gujarat on Monday. Education Ministry said, this is for the first
 time that education and skilling is being brought under the same institutional
 forum.
- This is expected to foster collaboration, participation and synergy in critical areas of mutual interest in the education and the skill domain.
- Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Minister for Education,
 Government of Australia Jason Clare will co-chair the meeting. The meeting will
 provide a platform for academic and skill experts to discuss a wide range of
 mutually agreed priorities, with the aim of shaping the future of education and
 skilling in both the nations.
- The meeting will be attended by senior government officials from India and Australia along with heads of Higher Education Institutions and skill sectors from both the countries.



Chief Information Commissioner

- Information Commissioner **Heeralal Samariya** sworn-in as the Chief Information Commissioner. President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to him at Rashtrapati Bhavan.
- Mr. Samariya was currently serving as the Information Commissioner in the Central Information Commission.
- The Central Information Commission is a statutory body, set up under the Right to Information Act in 2005 under the Government of India to act upon complaints from those individuals who have not been able to submit information requests to a Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer due to either the officer not have been appointed, or because the respective Central Assistant Public Information Officer or State Assistant Public Information Officer refused to receive the application for information under the Right to Information Act.



Women For Water, Water For Women Campaign

- The **Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry** will launch, a three-day Women for Water, Water for Women Campaign to celebrate Jal Diwali.
- The Ministry said that women Self Help Groups (SHG) will visit more than 500 fifty water treatment plants as part of the campaign.

- It added the aim is **to provide a platform for the inclusion of women in water governance**, and instill a sense of ownership and belonging towards water infrastructure.
- The Ministry is expecting more than **15 thousand SHG women** to participate nationwide in the first phase.



- The campaign is part of the Ministry's flagship scheme, Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation in partnership with the National Urban Livelihood Mission.
- Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation is a development mission launched by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi in June 2015 with the focus to establish infrastructure that could ensure adequate robust sewage networks and water supply for urban transformation by implementing urban revival projects.



Sultan Of Johor Cup 2023

- The Indian junior men's hockey team added another feather to their cap by securing the bronze medal in a heart-stopping match at the Sultan of Johor Cup 2023, in Johar, Malaysia.
- In an electrifying 3rd/4th place contest, they faced arch-rivals Pakistan and emerged victorious in a dramatic penalty shootout.
- This victory marks a significant milestone for the young Indian hockey talents and it is an evident of their relentless hard work and determination.
- This victory marked **India's third title in the Sultan of Johor Cup**. The junior men's hockey team had previously won the prestigious Johor Bahru Cup twice in **2013 and 2014**.
- They reached the final in the 2019 edition but narrowly lost 2-1 to Great Britain. Prior to this year's triumph, they had finished as runner-up in the tournament four times, in 2012, 2015, 2018 and in the last edition in 2019.
- Germany emerged as the champion of the 11th Sultan of Johor Cup, securing the gold medal by defeating Australia 3-1 in a penalty shootout. India has to face a tough defeat at the hands Germany in the semi-finals, but they bounced back to seize the bronze, making their presence felt on the international stage.



US, South Korea And Japan To Establish New Forum

• The **US**, **South Korea and Japan** will establish a new forum to coordinate responses to illicit **North Korean cyber operations** that fund its nuclear program, Seoul's presidential office announced.



- The Office of National Security said that the high-level trilateral consultative body will seek to strengthen practical joint response capabilities against global cyber threats, including measures to block cyber activities that are abused as major sources of funds for North Korea's weapons development, such as nuclear and WMD.
- The new council's formation is in line with the result of the three countries' summit at Camp David in August, during which their leaders expressed concern about North Korea's illicit cyber activities and decided to establish a trilateral interagency working group.



Women's Asian Champions Trophy

- In Hockey, the **Indian women's team dethroned Japan** to crown themselves Asian Champions Trophy winners.
- India overcame the two-time champions through goals from Sangita Kumari, Neha, Laremsiami and Vandana Katariya. India won their maiden Asian Champions Trophy title in 2016 in Singapore, while Japan bagged the crown twice, in 2013 and 2021.



- Earlier in the day, Asian Games champions China beat South Korea 2-1 to secure the third place. Yi Chen and Tiantian Luo scored for the winners while Sujin An found the target for Korea.
- In recognition of their exceptional performance, marked by an undefeated streak throughout the tournament and their title victory, Hockey India announced 3 lakh rupees to each player, and 1.50 lakh rupees each for support staff. Jharkhand's Salima Tete was announced the Player of the Tournament.





India's Largest Cold Oil Production Facility In Gujarat

- **IIT Madras** has become the **first Indian Institute of Technology** to establish an international campus on the picturesque **Zanzibar Island in East Africa**.
- Inaugurated by the President of Zanzibar, Hussein Ali Mwinyi, this historic initiative signifies a brighter educational future, facilitated by a memorandum of understanding between India and Tanzania, ushering in a new era of global education and cooperation.
- The establishment of the IIT Madras Zanzibar Campus represents a remarkable achievement for both India and Tanzania.
- This endeavor reflects the Indian government's commitment to spreading the excellence of India's education system to international arenas.
- While the initial campus is located in the Bweleo district, approximately 15 kilometers south of Zanzibar Town, there are plans for a permanent campus to be jointly developed by the Government of Zanzibar and the Government of India.

- In a similar effort, the **government previously introduced** the Bharat Dal scheme, offering chickpeas (chana dal) and affordable onions to further support consumer welfare.




Abua Bir Dishom Abhiyan

The Jharkhand government launched a special campaign named "Abua Bir
 Dishom Abhiyan" with the goal of providing land title certificates to individuals and communities under the Forest Rights Act.



- This initiative is **aimed at recognizing and securing** the rights of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers to self-cultivation, habitation, and various other activities within forest areas.
- Here, we delve into the reasons behind this drive and the challenges it faces.
 The Jharkhand government is determined to streamline the process of generating Forest Rights Act claims and distributing titles.
- To achieve this, it has established a dedicated website and mobile application to facilitate tracking of applications and verification of geotagged land parcels.



- The Forest Rights Act (FRA) of 2006 recognizes the rights of forest-dwelling tribal communities and other traditional forest dwellers to forest resources. The act was intended to address the "historical injustice" done to "traditional forest dwellers" of India.
- It was enacted to protect the **right to life and livelihood** of scheduled tribes and other traditional forest dwellers.

UK To Add India To Safe States List

- The United Kingdom has put forth plans to include India in an expanded list of safe states, which will have significant implications for individuals arriving in the UK illegally from these countries.
- This move, which aims to expedite the process of returning Indian nationals who have traveled illegally from India and **simultaneously eliminate their chances of seeking asylum in Britain**, has been met with both support and criticism.



- India and Georgia are the two countries featured in the draft legislation that has been laid in the House of Commons.
- The inclusion of these countries has been justified based on the premise that citizens from these nations are not typically at risk of persecution
- The UK's safe states list, known legislatively as **Section 80AA**, includes countries like Albania, Switzerland, and the European Union (EU) and European Economic Area (EEA) states.



World's First Al Human Like Robot CEO

- Hanson Robotics and Dictador, a Polish run company, have appointed the world's first humanoid robot CEO named Mika.
- This innovative project aims to blend **advanced artificial intelligence** and machine learning with the unique values of the company.
- While this development sparks excitement about the potential of AI in leadership roles, it also raises concerns among workers about job security.
- Mika utilizes advanced AI and machine learning algorithms to swiftly and accurately process data.
- However, concerns have been raised about a "significant delay" in Mika's response time, highlighting the evolving nature of AI technology.



Raja Bhalindra Trophy

- The recently concluded **2023 National Games** showcased an extraordinary display of athleticism, determination, and sportsmanship, with nearly **11**,000 athletes from across India participating in 45 different sports.
- Maharashtra emerged as the undisputed champions, claiming the top spot in the medal tally and securing the prestigious Raja Bhalindra Singh Rolling Trophy for the overall championship.
- Maharashtra secured an impressive haul of 80 gold medals, 69 silver medals, and 79 bronze medals, totaling 228 medals.



- **Bhalindra Singh** was born on 9 October 1919 in Patiala, Punjab Province, British India. He was a younger son of Maharaja Bhupinder Singh of Patiala.
- Singh's mother was Jaswant Kaur. His elder brother was Yadavindra Singh, the last Maharaja of Patiala.



 Bhalindra Singh was an Indian sports administrator and former first-class cricketer. Singh was an influential sports administrator who held positions in international and Indian sports governing bodies.

UPI Safety Ambassador



- Private sector players have also contributed to the ecosystem by offering a diverse range of digital payment services.


Grammy Awards 2024

- Shah is a strong advocate for millets and has been working to promote their cultivation and consumption in India and around the world.




Monkey Chimera

- However, it also raises ethical concerns regarding the use of nonhuman primates in scientific research.




Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to launch the PM-PVTG Development Mission, a groundbreaking scheme aimed at fostering the comprehensive development of approximately 28 lakh people belonging to Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs).
- This significant event is scheduled to coincide with the **birth anniversary celebration of the revered tribal freedom fighter, Birsa Munda**, observed as **Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas** for the past three years.



- The launch ceremony is strategically planned to take place in Jharkhand's Khunti district, specifically after a visit to Ulihatu village, the birthplace of Birsa Munda.
- This visit will mark a historic moment as Prime Minister Modi becomes the first sitting Prime Minister to visit this village.
- The PM-PVTG Development Mission aims to address the critical needs of the 75 PVTG communities residing in over 22,000 remote villages across 18 States and Union Territories.
- The focus areas include power, water, road connectivity, housing, education, and healthcare.
- This comprehensive approach aligns with the government's commitment to uplifting marginalized communities.
- Prime Minister Modi is expected to launch the "Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra" from Khunti, with the ambitious goal of achieving saturation of flagship government schemes across the country.
- This Yatra will commence from tribal-dominated districts, aiming to cover all districts by January 2024.
- The initiative reflects the government's dedication to extending the benefits of its schemes to the remotest corners of the nation.



Airgun Surrender Abhiyan

- The Airgun Surrender Abhiyan initiative of Arunachal Pradesh Government has been selected as India's best success story on wildlife conservation to present in the UNESCO's International Conference on Biosphere Reserves held at Sabah, Malaysia.
- Dr. Damodhar A.T. represented India on the occasion and presented India's country report along with the success story in this UNESCO's International Conference and meeting on Biosphere Reserves.



The Airgun Surrender Abhiyan is an initiative of the Department of Environment,
 Forest and Climate Change of the state Government.

- Under the scheme people were invited to voluntarily surrender their Airguns and licensed guns to stop the use of these guns to kill birds and other wild animals.
- The programme was officially launched on **March 17, 2021** at Lumdung in East Kameng District where in 46 air guns were surrendered and **Lumdung was** declared first Airgun free village of Arunachal Pradesh.

Shital Mahajan Makes History

- Indian skydiver **Shital Mahajan** jumped off a helicopter from the height of **21,500** ft in front of the world's highest peak, Mt Everest.
- She became the **first woman to do so**. Mahajan landed at Kalapatthar peak at an altitude 17,444ft.
- Mahajan is a well-known Indian skydiver who holds several skydiving records and is the recipient of the fourth highest civilian award, the Padma Shri in 2001.



International Science Festival

- The **9th edition of the India International Science Festival** (IISF) 2023 will be held at **Faridabad, Haryana** from January 17th-20th, 2024.
- India's mega Science Fair will be held at the Campus of Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI) and Regional Centre for Biotechnology (RCB) of Department of Biotechnology in Faridabad.
- The theme of the present edition is 'Science and Technology Public Outreach in Amrit Kaal'.
- IISF 2023 aims to provide a platform for inspiring public at large and individuals with diverse levels of interests like students, educators, scientists, researchers, industry professionals, entrepreneurs and science communicators.



- IISF 2023 will have a total of **17 themes to showcase scientific achievements** offering diverse benefits to participants and the general public.
- The event holds interface among all stakeholders through various activities such as seminars by national and international experts, interactions with speakers, exhibitions, competitions, workshops, knowledge-sharing activities, technology shows, etc.
- The IISF is dedicated towards fostering creativity in Science, Technology and Innovation for the advancement of prosperous India. This event was initiated under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi through collaborative efforts of the Ministry of Science and Technology and the Ministry of Earth Sciences in association with Vijnana Bharati.
- Since 2015, the IISF has hosted eight editions in different geographical regions of India and expanded as a mega science festival. In 2021, the Department of Space and the Department of Atomic Energy became an integral part of IISF.

- An average of 38 lakh fishers per year are insured under the Group Accident Insurance Scheme.

- **Prime Minister Petteri Orpo** said that it is an attempt to stem the flow of asylum seekers.
- According to media reports, the move comes in response to a sharp increase in the number of asylum-seekers from countries such as Iraq, Yemen, Somalia, and Syria.
- Finland shares a 1,340-kilometer frontier with Russia, which also serves as the EU's external border with Russia. There are only nine crossing points, one of which is only a railway.

Loneliness A Pressing Global Health Threat - WHO

- The World Health Organization (WHO) has declared loneliness as a pressing global health threat.
- The WHO also launched an **international commission** on the problem, led by the US surgeon general, **Dr Vivek Murthy**.
- The commission will run for three years. Dr Murthy said that the mortality effects of loneliness are equivalent to smoking 15 cigarettes a day.
- He said, the rate of 'one in four' older people experiencing social isolation is similar in all regions of the world.
- It comes after the Covid-19 pandemic halted economic and social activity, increasing levels of loneliness, but also amid rising awareness of the importance of the issue.



Herbicide Glyphosate

- The European Union approved the use of the controversial herbicide
 Glyphosate for another 10 years.
- Meanwhile, the EU Commission said that there will be new conditions and restrictions including a prohibition of pre-harvest use as a desiccant and the need for certain measures to protect non-target organisms.



 Representatives of EU states were unable to reach a decision last month, and a new vote by an appeal committee was again inconclusive. The current period of authorization was due to expire in mid-December.

Glyphosate is one of the most widely used weedkiller in the world, however, critics point to evidence that it **may cause cancer** and pose a risk to biodiversity.
