Guru Tegh Bahadur On His Martyrdom Day

 Martyrdom Day of Guru Tegh Bahadur, the ninth Guru of Sikhs, is being observed 24 November. It was on this in 1675, Guru Tegh Bahadur sacrificed his life to protect religion, human values, ideals and principles. The martyrdom of Guru Tegh Bahadur is remembered as Shaheedi Divas every year.



- During Aurangzeb's rule, many Hindus, including Kashmiri Pandits, were forced to convert to Islam. Unable to endure this, they sought help from Guru Tegh Bahadur. The Guru took a bold stand, declaring that if he could be converted, others would follow.
- Despite being imprisoned for four months and witnessing the execution of three followers, Guru Tegh Bahadur remained firm in his faith. Ultimately, he was executed by beheading on 11th November 1675.
- His sacrifice is remembered for his courage and refusal to give in to oppression.
- several Gurudwaras honor Guru Tegh Bahadur's bravery and sacrifice:
- Gurudwara Sis Ganj Sahib, located at the site of his martyrdom in Chandni Chowk, Delhi.



- Gurudwara Rakab Ganj Sahib, where his body was cremated by a devoted follower.
- Gurudwara Sisganj Sahib in Punjab, where his head, brought from Delhi, was cremated.

Nayi Chetna Pahal Badlaav Ki

 Union Rural Development Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan will launch the third edition of Nayi Chetna- Pahal Badlaav Ki on the 25th of November at Akashvani's Rang Bhawan.



- Nayi Chetna is a National Campaign that aims to amplify awareness and drive informed action against gender-based violence through grassroots initiatives.
 The Month campaign will run across all States and Union Territories till the 23rd of December.
- The slogan for this year's campaign is Ek Saath, Ek Awaaz, Hinsa Ke Khilaaf. It is organized by the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihoods

Mission under the aegis of the Rural Development Ministry. The initiative is led by an extensive Self-Help Group network under this mission.

COP29: Commit To \$1.3 Trillion Baku Finance

- At COP29 in Baku, Azerbaijan, world leaders agreed on the Baku Finance Goal, committing 1.3 trillion dollars in climate finance for developing countries by 2035.
- This includes a core annual target of 300 billion dollars, tripling the previous 100 billion dollars goal. Despite the progress, developing nations, including India, criticized the agreement as insufficient, calling for greater ambition to address urgent climate needs.



- India's Secretary of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change Leena Nandan, said, the goal is too little and too distant. She said, our estimate tells us we need to do 1.3 trillion dollars by 2030, yet we have only 300 billion dollars a year. She said, it does not address the needs and priorities of developing countries.
- The major key outcomes of the Baku Finance Goal included, Finalization of
 Article 6 on carbon markets, potentially channeling 1 trillion dollars annually by
 2050 and Steps to operationalize the Loss and Damage Fund, with distribution
 set to begin in 2025 with Commitments to enhanced transparency and
 adaptation measures.



- COP29 President Mukhtar Babayev hailed the achievements as transformative, saying, billions will turn into trillions over the next decade. However, UN Climate Chief Simon Stiell acknowledged significant work remains, urging nations to strengthen their climate plans next year.
- Critics argue the agreement offers inadequate support to vulnerable nations.
 The summit concluded with calls to sustain momentum ahead of COP30 in Belém, Brazil, in 2025.

Dr. S Jaishankar Three Day Official Visit To Italy

- External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar is on a three day official visit to Italy.
 He will travel to Fiuggi, Italy to participate in the Outreach session of the G7
 Foreign Ministers' Meeting, where India has been invited as a guest country.
- He is also expected to meet his counterparts from Italy and other participating nations in the G7 related engagements and hold bilateral discussions during the visit.



- During the visit, the External Affairs Minister will also participate in the **10th** edition of the MED Mediterranean Dialogue in Rome.
- It is being organised by Institute for International Political Studies in collaboration with Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Italy. Dr Jaishankar will also inaugurate the new premises of the Embassy of India in Rome.

Global Peace Award In Washington

- Association of Indian American Minorities (AIAM), a newly launched non-governmental organization, was inaugurated, at the Sligo Seventh-day Adventist Church in Maryland, USA.
- The organization aims to **foster unity and uplift minority communities** within the Indian American diaspora.



- During the launch event, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was honored in absentia with the 'Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Global Peace Award for Minority Upliftment', recognizing his efforts in inclusive development and minority welfare.
- His initiatives for inclusive growth and minority welfare were recognized globally. The organization has a seven-member Board of Directors representing diverse Indian minority communities: Sikhs, Christians, Hindus, Muslims, and Jews.

ISRO And ASA Join Hands For Gaganyaan Mission

- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has entered into a significant collaboration with the Australian Space Agency (ASA) to support India's first crewed spaceflight program, Gaganyaan.
- Two space agencies signed an Implementation Agreement (IA) to enhance cooperation on crew and crew module recovery, which is crucial for the success of the Gaganyaan mission.



- This agreement will provide India with the necessary assistance to ensure the safe recovery of astronauts in the event of a contingency during the mission.
- This will ensure that both agencies are prepared to handle any **contingencies during the ascent phase**, particularly if the crew module aborts near Australian waters.
- Gaganyaan mission aims to demonstrate India's capability to carry out a Low Earth Orbit (LEO) mission with an Indian Crew Module. The mission will carry up to three astronauts for a duration of up to three days in space and is designed to safely recover the crew module after the mission's completion.
- ASA will play a crucial role in the support system for the Gaganyaan mission by providing search and rescue operations in the event of a contingency and ensuring safe recovery of the crew module.
- This support is particularly significant for any abort scenario during the ascent phase, which may occur near Australian waters.



 India and Australia share a strong strategic partnership, with both countries committed to exploring further opportunities for collaboration in space exploration. The IA marks an important step in strengthening bilateral cooperation, not just in space, but in other areas as well.

India Hosts 1st Global Cooperative Conference

India will host the International Cooperative Alliance (ICA) Global Cooperative
 Conference in New Delhi from November 25 to 30, 2024. This marks the first
 time in the 130-year history of the ICA that the global cooperative movement's
 premier event will be held in India.



 Prime Minister Narendra Modi will launch the United Nations International Year of Cooperatives 2025 during this event. First Time in India: The ICA General Assembly and Global Cooperative Conference will be hosted by India, an initiative led by IFFCO.



- Around 3,000 delegates, including 1,000 international delegates from over 100 countries. Bhutan Prime Minister Dasho Tshering Tobgay and Fiji Deputy PM Manoa Kamikamica will attend.
- Union Cooperation Minister Amit Shah will chair the inaugural session on November 25. Theme: "Cooperatives Build Prosperity for All"
- Subthemes: Enabling Policy and Entrepreneurial Ecosystems, Nurturing
 Purposeful Leadership for Prosperity, Reaffirming the Cooperative Identity,
 Shaping the Future for Prosperity in the 21st Century



- Special Features
- Carbon Neutral: The event will be carbon neutral with sustainable practices like the planting of 10,000 Peepal trees.
- Catering: Only vegetarian food will be served, with no liquor allowed.
- India's Role: Cooperative Landscape: India houses 25% of the world's cooperatives, with 8 lakh cooperatives nationwide. The conference will showcase the strength of India's cooperative sector.
- ICA was established in 1895 to promote the cooperative model.
- Headquarters: Geneva, Switzerland.
- Moved from London in 1982
- It is the apex body representing cooperatives.
- More than 306 organizations from 105 countries are members of the ICA.
- The ICA unites, represents, and serves cooperatives worldwide.
- It provides a global voice and forum for knowledge, expertise, and coordinated action for and about cooperatives.

India's First Constitution Museum

• India will inaugurate its **first Constitution Museum in Sonipat**, Haryana, which will be attended by prominent leaders, including Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla. The museum will be located at **O.P. Jindal Global University** (JGU) and aims to tell the significance of the Constitution of India.




- The museum will feature interactive displays and advanced technology. Visitors
 will experience AI-driven installations and 3D exhibits. It will showcase the
 Constitution's history over 75 years.
- Each section of the Constitution will be represented. Various formats will be used, including text, audio-visuals, and experiential exhibits. The museum will highlight profiles of the Constituent Assembly members.



- Dr. B.R. Ambedkar will be prominently featured. He is recognized as the
 principal architect of the Constitution. The aim is to honor the contributions of
 these key figures.
- The museum is part of the S.A.M.V.I.D. project, which is a collaboration between JGU and IIT Madras. It seeks to make learning engaging and interactive. The project focuses on innovative storytelling techniques.

World Military Championships

In Wrestling, India have clinched a total of seven medals including three Gold, one Silver and three Bronze at the World Military Championships in Yerevan, Armenia. Among the gold medal winners are India's Reetika Hooda in the women's 76kg category, Jyoti Sihag in the women's 55kg category and Jaideep in the Men's 74 kg Freestyle category.



- Subedar Sharwan bagged the silver medal in the men's 70 kg Free Style.
- **Bronze category medal holders** in the Men's category include Shubham in the 57 kg Free Style and Chandermohan in the 79 kg Free Style. While Priyanka bagged the bronze in the 68 Kg Women's category. India sent a women's contingent to the World Military **Championships for the first time this year**.



ATP Challenger Tour In Italy

• In Tennis, N Sriram Balaji and Rithvik Bollipalli have won Men's Doubles title at the ATP Challenger Tour in Italy.



- They defeated second-seeded French tennis player **Theo Arribage and his Portuguese partner Francisco Cabral** in the final.
- This was Rithvik Bollipalli's second title on the ATP Challenger Tour, having
 won the crown at the Almaty Open in Kazakhstan last month with Arjun Kadhe.
 For the 34-year-old Balaji, this was the first tennis title on the ATP Challenger
 Tour.
