

### Jan Aushadhi Diwas

 Jan Aushadhi Diwas. The day is celebrated to raise awareness about the scheme and promote the use of generic medicines. Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP) aims to make quality generic medicines available at affordable prices to all.



- Chemicals and Fertilizers Ministry organised week-long activities nationwide to support this initiative. Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana was launched in November 2008 to provide quality medicines at affordable prices to the public through dedicated outlets called Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendras.
- The scheme provides medicines at prices 50 to 80 per cent less than the
  market. It also provides medicines procured only from certified manufacturers
  to ensure the quality of the products.
- One of the major initiatives launched under the initiative includes the Suvidha
   Sanitary Napkins at one rupee per pad only. Over 15 thousand Janaushadhi
   Kendras are now operational across all districts of the country and the scheme
   has created a promising avenue for self-employment, offering sustainable and
   regular earnings.

### Asia's Largest Literature Festival 'Sahityaotsav'



### "Nari Shakti Se Viksit Bharat" Conference


 President Droupadi Murmu will inaugurate a national conference in New Delhi on International Women's Day on the 8th of this month. The Conference is being organised on the theme of "Nari Shakti Se Viksit Bharat" by the Women and Child Development Ministry.




- Women from various fields will participate in the event, including officers from the armed forces and paramilitary forces, Delhi police, My Bharat volunteers, Anganwadi Workers, ASHA workers and Self Help Group members.
- The event will also mark the presence of representatives from international organisations such as the World Bank, UNICEF, United Nations Women, UNDP and UNFPA. A social media campaign with the hashtag "SheBuildsBharat" is also being organised. Minister for Women and Child Development, Annapurna Devi said that the day provides an opportunity to discuss the multi-faceted development of women and remove the obstacles to achieving this.

### **Wallace Line & Biodiversity**

- Wallace Line is concept in biogeography. It marks the distinct biodiversity found in Asia and Australia. This line was identified by Alfred Russel Wallace in the late 19th century. He observed a sharp contrast in species composition between these two regions.
- The Wallace Line runs between Bali and Lombok, extending north between Borneo and Sulawesi, and curves south of Mindanao. This geographical barrier has deep implications for the distribution of species. Wallace conducted extensive research over eight years.



- He noted a dramatic shift in animal species as he crossed the Wallace Line. On either side of the line, different organisms thrived. For instance, Australia is known for its marsupials, while Asia is home to a diverse range of mammals.
- Wallace's observations laid the groundwork for **modern biogeography**. **Sulawesi is particularly intriguing**. It is home to species not found anywhere else, such as tarsiers and the anoa.
- Despite being close to Borneo, the island supports distinct flora and fauna.
   Wallace struggled to classify Sulawesi's species. He recognised their affiliations with various regions, including Africa and India. This complexity raises questions about species migration and adaptation.



### 2025 Pritzker Architecture Prize

Chinese architect and educator Liu Jiakun has won the 2025 Pritzker
 Architecture Prize, the most important award in architecture. This prize honors
 him for combining traditional Chinese styles with modern design and for his
 efforts to create fair and inclusive spaces.



- **Jiakun, who was born** and still works in Chengdu, China, is the second Chinese architect to receive this award after Wang Shu in 2012.
- Previous winners include Riken Yamamoto (2024), David Chipperfield (2023), and Francis Kéré (2022).

• Liu, 68, becomes the **54th laureate of the prize, considered** akin to a Nobel in the field of architecture. The award ceremony will take place this spring at the Louvre Abu Dhabi, designed by Jean Nouvel.

### China's Crackdown On Neijuan

 Chinese Premier Li Qiang addressed the National People's Congress, denoting the government's commitment to combating 'Neijuan'. This term, meaning involutionary competition, describes a cycle of diminishing returns caused by excessive competition.



- As China's economy slows, the government seeks to create a sustainable business environment while addressing international criticism. Neijuan refers to intense competition that leads to reduced returns. It forces companies and individuals to exert more effort without proportional benefits.
- In the business context, firms engage in price wars and overproduction to maintain market share, harming profitability. For workers, it translates to longer hours and constant upskilling without a better quality of life.
- Neijuan is evident in China's thriving sectors, particularly in electric vehicles (EVs). Companies slash prices to outdo each other, resulting in unsustainable practices. This aggressive competition leads to lower profits and market instability.



Chinese government has intensified its approach to curb Neijuan. This marks a
shift in policy focus towards sustainable growth. Officials aim to eliminate
market fragmentation and local protectionism. They are promoting fair
competition and innovation over destructive price wars.

### Ganga Water Treaty

Ganga Water Treaty, signed in 1996, will expire in 2026. This upcoming
meeting between India and Bangladesh is crucial for future water-sharing
agreements. Bangladesh seeks a larger share of dry-season water, denoting
severe shortages affecting agriculture.



 The backdrop includes rising tensions following political changes in Bangladesh and unresolved disputes over water-sharing, notably the Teesta River. The Ganga River has been a source of conflict between India and Bangladesh for decades. The Farakka Barrage, operational since 1975, was built to manage water flow but intensified disputes.



• The treaty established a framework for sharing water, recognising Bangladesh as a lower riparian state. It aims to balance the needs of both countries while addressing historical grievances. The treaty outlines specific water-sharing formulas based on the Ganga's flow at the Farakka Barrage during the dry season.



• If water availability is 70,000 cusecs or less, both countries receive equal shares. The treaty also guarantees minimum water flow for both nations during critical periods. A Joint Rivers Commission was formed to oversee compliance and resolve disputes.

### **Prague Chess Festival 2025**

At the 7th Prague International Chess Festival 2025 Masters, Indian Grand Master Aravindh Chithambaram drew with David Navara in the penultimate round and made a sole lead of 5.5/7. R. Praggnanandhaa also drew his game against Liem Quang Le and moved to 5/7. On the other hand, Wei Yi defeated Thai Dai Van Nguyen to move to 4.5/7. Now, Aravindh winning against Ediz Gurel will make him a clear champion. However, a draw means, Praggnanandhaa can catch up and force tie-breaks if he manages to beat Anish Giri.
