International Red Panda Day 2025

- International Red Panda Day 2025 is being celebrated on Saturday, September 20 (3rd Saturday of September) Launched in 2010 by the Red Panda Network, this day has grown into a global campaign involving zoos, schools, and communities worldwide.
- Native to the Eastern Himalayas, red pandas are found in Nepal, India, Bhutan,
 Myanmar, and China. Though about the size of a house cat, their bushy, striped tails and rich red fur give them a foxlike appearance.
- Red pandas are endangered population halved in 20 years.
- Human actions are the primary threat including habitat destruction, poaching, and the pet trade.
- Solutions exist reforestation, education, patrols, and community involvement are making a difference.



Arshdeep Singh Becomes First Indian to Reach 100 T20I Wickets

- Arshdeep Singh has etched his name in the record books by becoming the first Indian bowler to claim 100 T20I wickets, reaching the milestone during India's final group game of the 2025 Asia Cup against Oman.
- He dismissed Vinayak Shukla to get there in just 64 matches, making him one of the fastest to achieve this landmark globally.

- Hilsa, often called the "Queen of Fish", holds not only culinary but also cultural significance during Bengal's biggest festival. However, this year's reduced quota and tight shipment window have raised concerns among importers and consumers alike.
- Origin Matters: The Bangladeshi hilsa, especially from the Padma River, is widely considered superior in taste and texture compared to its Indian counterpart from the Hooghly River.
- **Cultural Demand:** In West Bengal, Assam, and Tripura, hilsa is not just a delicacy but also part of ritualistic and celebratory meals, especially during Durga Puja.



India Records First Half-Year CO₂ Emission Drop in 2025

- For the first time outside a crisis period like the COVID-19 lockdown, India has recorded a fall in carbon dioxide emissions from its electricity sector.
- According to an analysis by the Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air (CREA) for the UK-based Carbon Brief, CO₂ emissions dropped by 1% between January and June 2025, compared to the same period in 2024.

- Given that the electricity sector accounts for nearly 40% of India's total greenhouse gas emissions, this minor but symbolic decline is a landmark development in the country's environmental trajectory.
- India added 25.1 GW of clean energy capacity in the first half of 2025—a 70% jump over last year. These additions included solar, wind, hydropower, and nuclear installations.
- India is currently the third-largest CO₂ emitter in the world, behind China and the US.
- Historically, its emissions have risen steadily with economic growth.
- The government has set a national target of 500 GW of non-fossil fuel capacity by 2030.



QS Global MBA Rankings 2026

India Looks More FTA in Gulf, GCC

• After the UAE, government is looking at trade pacts with individual countries in West Asia, instead of the earlier plan for an agreement with the Gulf Cooperation Council, commerce & industry minister Piyush Goyal said.

- "The agreement with the UAE has been the most successful trade agreement so far. The one with Oman will be signed soon and the terms of reference with Qatar are being discussed," he said.
- While India and GCC were pursuing a trade agreement, India went ahead and signed the treaty with UAE as the one with the bloc was taking time, possibly due to Saudi Arabia's reluctance. Goyal said that the proposal for an FTA with GCC is not on the table at the moment.
- In recent months, govt has been pursuing an aggressive agenda on trade agreements, engaging with several countries, ranging from the UK and EU to Peru. Sources said the agreement with Oman is undergoing vetting and translation before being sent for clearances.
- Companies in UAE have shown significant interest in partnering with Indian players to export to third countries in Africa and central Asia, industry executives said.

GCC

- "GCC" can refer to several entities, but commonly refers to the Gulf Cooperation Council, a regional political and economic union in the Middle East, and the GNU Compiler Collection, a free and open-source collection of compilers.
- It can also refer to Global Capability Centers, which are large technology service centers established by multinational companies, and the Greater Chennai Corporation, the municipal corporation of Chennai, India.

Trump Slaps \$100,000 Fee On H-1B Visas

- US President Donald Trump, in his latest efforts to crack down on immigration, signed a proclamation imposing a \$100,000 (over Rs 88 lakh) fee on H-1B visa applicants a move that could potentially deal a significant blow to the technology sector, which relies heavily on skilled workers from India and China.
- According to Trump, the move is aimed at ensuring that the people being brought into the country are "actually very highly skilled" and do not replace American workers. "We need workers. We need great workers, and this pretty much ensures that that's what's going to happen," he said.

What is the H-1B visa

- The H-1B visa is a temporary US work visa that allows companies to hire foreign professionals with specialised skills. It was created in 1990 for people with a bachelor's degree or higher in fields where jobs are deemed hard to fill, especially science, technology, engineering, and math.
- The visa is initially granted for three years, but can be extended to a maximum of six years. For those who received a Green Card (permanent residency), the visa can be renewed indefinitely. To apply, candidates register online with the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), following which a lottery system randomly selects applicants.
- The Trump administration, however, is weighing further changes to the way applications are considered.

Impact on Indians

- Indians have been consistently making up the majority of H-1B visa holders. According to government data, India was the largest beneficiary of H-1B visas last year, accounting for 71 per cent of approved beneficiaries, reported news agency Reuters. China was a distant second at 11.7 per cent.
- Trump's 'Gold Card' visa program
- Trump also signed an executive order for a 'Gold Card' visa program with fees set at \$1 million for individuals and \$2 million for businesses. "We think it's going to be very successful... It's going to raise billions of dollars, which will reduce taxes, pay off debt, and do other good things," the Republican leader said.
