Joint Submarine Rescue Support

- In a significant step towards strengthening maritime security, India and Vietnam signed a Memorandum of Agreement on Mutual Submarine Search and Rescue Support and Cooperation.
- This development took place during the 15th India–Vietnam Defence Policy Dialogue held in Hanoi, co-chaired by India's Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh and Vietnam's Deputy Defence Minister Sr Lt Gen Hoang Xuan Chien.
- The agreement aims to ensure prompt assistance in submarine emergencies, while a Letter of Intent (LoI) was also signed to boost defence industry collaboration.
- This includes,
- Coordinated search and rescue operations
- Deployment of personnel, equipment and technical expertise
- Shared protocols and training to ensure operational readiness



World Science Day 2025

Bangladesh Becomes First Nation to Join UN Water Convention

- In a landmark move, Bangladesh has officially acceded to the UN Water Convention in 2025, becoming the first South Asian country to do so.
- This decision signals a significant shift in the region's approach to transboundary water governance and could impact existing bilateral water-sharing dynamics, particularly with India. As global water stress intensifies, Bangladesh's accession represents a strategic step to secure its interests through a multilateral legal framework.
- Bangladesh shares 54 rivers with India, including the Teesta and Ganga, which
 are vital for its agriculture, drinking water, and ecosystem sustainability.
- India has not joined the UN Water Convention. It continues to rely on bilateral treaties like,
- Indus Waters Treaty (1960) with Pakistan
- Ganga Water Sharing Treaty (1996) with Bangladesh



India Quietly Withdraws from Ayni Airbase in Tajikistan

- India has withdrawn from the Ayni airbase in Tajikistan, its only full-fledged overseas military facility. The move, which took place in 2022, has recently come to light and marks a major recalibration in India's Central Asia posture.
- With this closure, India no longer operates any functional military base outside its territory, reducing its physical military presence in a region critical to its strategic interests.
- Originally a Soviet-era airbase, Ayni was in a state of disrepair after the collapse of the USSR. India stepped in as a strategic partner in 2002, investing nearly \$80 million to modernize the facility.
- Located just 20 km from Afghanistan's Wakhan Corridor, Ayni offered India a vantage point near Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) and China's Xinjiang province, placing it in close proximity to multiple volatile zones and power competition areas.



23rd National Maritime SAR Board Meet

- ICG organised the 23rd National Maritime Search and Rescue (NMSAR) Board meeting on Nov 10, 2025, in Gandhinagar, Gujarat. The meeting focused on enhancing inter-agency coordination and collaboration among stakeholders to strengthen India's overall search and rescue (SAR) framework.
- Discussions centred on leveraging technology and modern communication systems to improve operational efficiency and maritime safety standards.

- MV He Yuan Shun 89, a Panama-flagged vessel, received the award in the Merchant Vessel category
- Indian Fishing Boat Kedarnath Bhole was awarded in the Fishing Boat category
- ICG Ship Rajveer received the award for the Government-owned SAR Unit category
- Vessel Traffic System (VTS), Mumbai Port Authority and Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) were jointly felicitated in the Ashore Unit category.
