National Epilepsy Day 2025

- On 17 November 2025, India will observe National Epilepsy Day, a dedicated day
 to shed light on epilepsy—a neurological disorder that affects millions yet
 remains shrouded in misunderstanding.
- This observance encourages early diagnosis, treatment adherence, dispelling of myths and creating a more inclusive, supportive environment for people living with epilepsy.
- Recognition of recurrent seizures as a treatable medical condition
- Early and accurate diagnosis
- Timely and effective treatment
- Promotion of social acceptance and support from communities and workplaces
- The day was initiated by the Epilepsy Foundation of India, under the leadership of Dr Nirmal Surya, with a mission to reduce stigma and improve quality of life for people with epilepsy.



International Students' Day 2025

- International Students' Day, observed on November 17, might seem like a day of cultural programs, seminars, or campus celebrations. But its true origin is far more powerful and poignant.
- This day is rooted in the tragic yet courageous uprising of Czech students in 1939 Prague, who stood against Nazi oppression during World War II — an act that cost many their lives and freedom but sparked a global symbol of resistance and student solidarity.



National Press Day 2025

- National Press Day, observed every year on 16 November, celebrates the foundational role of the press as the fourth pillar of democracy. It highlights the enduring values of freedom of expression, ethical journalism, and public accountability.
- National Press Day commemorates the establishment of the Press Council of India (PCI) on 16 November 1966. Originally formed under the Indian Press Council Act, 1965, and reconstituted in 1979 under the current Press Council Act, PCI serves as an autonomous statutory body to protect press freedom and uphold journalistic standards.
- India's media landscape continues to flourish. The number of registered publications has increased from 60,143 in 2004–05 to over 1.54 lakh in 2024–25, reflecting the expanding reach of journalism in multiple languages and regions.

The feat places him alongside legends like Kapil Dev, Ian Botham, and Daniel Vettori, reaffirming his legacy as one of the game's greatest allrounders.

- In a landmark decision aimed at conserving one of India's richest ecological zones, the Supreme Court of India has directed the Jharkhand government to declare the Saranda Forest as a wildlife sanctuary.
- This ruling highlights the urgent need to protect the forest's rare biodiversity, ecological value, and tribal heritage, amidst increasing developmental pressures.
- The Saranda Forest, located in the West Singhbhum district of Jharkhand, spans an area of approximately 820 to 900 square kilometers. It is known as Asia's largest natural Sal (Shorea robusta) forest and is popularly referred to as the "land of seven hundred hills" due to its undulating, hilly terrain.

 Situated in the Chhotanagpur bio-geographic zone, Saranda forms a continuous forest belt with adjoining regions in Odisha and Chhattisgarh. It is a crucial wildlife habitat for many rare and critically endangered species
