
Cabinet Approves ₹2,781 Crore Rail Multitracking Projects

- In a key infrastructure move, the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved two critical multitracking railway projects worth ₹2,781 crore. These projects aim to strengthen the Indian Railways network in Maharashtra and Gujarat, enhancing both passenger and freight capacity.
- The approved projects will expand the railway network by approximately 224 km, benefitting over 32 lakh people across 4 districts and 585 villages.
- 1. Devbhumi Dwarka (Okha) Kanalus Doubling Project
- Length: 141 km
- State: Gujarat
- 2. Badlapur Karjat 3rd and 4th Line Project
- Length: 32 km
- State: Maharashtra
- Corridor: Mumbai suburban network
- These projects are part of the PM Gati Shakti initiative, aimed at building a multi-modal infrastructure ecosystem in India. The focus is on,

- Stakeholder collaboration




Scheme to Boost Rare Earth Magnet Manufacturing

- The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved a ₹7,280 crore scheme to promote domestic manufacturing of Sintered Rare Earth Permanent Magnets (REPMs).
- This is the first-ever initiative of its kind in India aimed at establishing an
 integrated REPM manufacturing ecosystem, thereby reducing dependency on
 imports, boosting high-tech industries, and supporting India's Net Zero 2070
 commitment.
- REPMs are among the strongest permanent magnets available today. They are essential components in modern technologies, including,
- Electric vehicles (EVs)
- Wind turbines and renewable energy systems
- Aerospace and defence equipment
- Industrial automation
- Consumer electronics
- The goal is to set up manufacturing capacity of 6,000 Metric Tons Per Annum
 (MTPA) of sintered REPMs within India. This includes the complete value chain,
- Conversion of rare earth oxides to metals
- Metals to high-performance alloys
- Alloys to finished REPMs



First Global Aircraft Engine MRO Facility

- On 26 November 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated India's first global-level aircraft engine Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) facility in Hyderabad. Developed by Safran, a French aerospace giant, the facility known as Safran Aircraft Engine Services India (SAESI) — marks a significant milestone in India's aviation sector.
- Aircraft Engine Services India (SAESI) marks a significant milestone in India's aviation sector. The Prime Minister described it as a "new flight" for India's aerospace ambitions, positioning the country to emerge as a global MRO hub and a preferred destination for aviation investments.
- Currently, around 85% of India's MRO work is done overseas. This costs the country significantly in terms of money, time, and operational efficiency.
- By building local capacity, India can,
- Save billions in foreign exchange
- Cut aircraft downtime
- Strengthen supply chain resilience
- Offer competitive MRO services to other nations



44th India International Trade Fair


2025 FIDE World Cup Champion

Latest ICC Men's ODI Batsmen Rankings



Constitution Day of India 2025


- Constitution Day, observed every year on November 26, commemorates the historic moment when the Constituent Assembly adopted the Constitution of India in 1949.
- The year 2025 marks the 76th anniversary of this landmark event—an occasion that not only celebrates India's democratic foundation but also reminds citizens of their commitment to constitutional values, rights, and duties.
- Before 2015, November 26 was observed as National Law Day to honour Dr.
 Bhimrao Ambedkar, the Chairman of the Drafting Committee and India's first Law Minister.
- In 2015, the Government of India officially declared November 26 as 'Constitution Day' (Samvidhan Divas) to promote constitutional awareness among citizens. The declaration also coincided with Dr. Ambedkar's 125th birth anniversary, paying tribute to the "chief architect of the Indian Constitution".

- The Indian Constitution was adopted on November 26, 1949, and came into force two months later on January 26, 1950, celebrated as Republic Day.
- The drafting process was one of the most extensive and inclusive in history. The Constituent Assembly spent:
- 2 years, 11 months, 18 days drafting the Constitution



National Milk Day 2025

- National Milk Day, celebrated annually on November 26, commemorates the birth anniversary of Dr. Verghese Kurien, hailed as the Father of the White Revolution in India.
- The 2025 celebration not only honours his vision and legacy but also reflects the nation's immense strides in transforming from a milk-deficient country to the world's largest milk producer, contributing nearly 25% of global milk output.
- In the 1950s and 1960s, India faced acute milk shortages, despite having the world's largest cattle population. The turning point came with the creation of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) in 1965 and the launch of Operation Flood in 1970, modeled on the success of the Anand cooperative.
