

FIDE Chess World Cup Trophy Renamed

- The FIDE Chess World Cup 2025 trophy has been renamed after Indian chess icon Viswanathan Anand. The new trophy will officially be called the Viswanathan Anand Cup, paying tribute to the five-time world champion's unparalleled contributions to global chess.
- The announcement was made during a grand ceremony held in Panjim, Goa, attended by Union Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya, Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant, and FIDE President Arkady Dvorkovich.
- Highlights of the FIDE Chess World Cup 2025
- Indian stars D. Gukesh and R. Praggnanandhaa are among the key participants, aiming to make their mark on the global stage.
- However, Magnus Carlsen and Hikaru Nakamura have opted not to participate this year.
- The World Women's Chess Cup champion Divya Deshmukh conducted the draw of lots for the event.
- A total of 206 players from 80 countries will compete across eight knockout rounds of classical games.
- Known as the "Tiger of Madras", Viswanathan Anand is widely regarded as India's first chess Grandmaster and a five-time World Chess Champion. His achievements not only popularized chess in India but also paved the way for a new generation of talents like Gukesh, Praggnanandhaa, and Nihal Sarin.

 cricket in the country.


• So far, in **13 editions** of the ICC Women's World Cup, Australia have won seven times, England four times, and New Zealand and India have lifted the trophy once.

On this occasion, PM Narendra Modi addressed the International Arya Mahasammelan in New Delhi, acknowledging the movement's immense role in reshaping India's religious, social, and educational fabric.

- Founded in Bombay in 1875 and formalized in Lahore in 1877, Arya Samaj emerged from Swami Dayanand Saraswati's mission to return to the original teachings of the Vedas.
- The movement rejected superstition, idol worship, and blind ritualism.
- "Back to the Vedas": Emphasizing truth, rationalism, and monotheism rooted in Vedic thought
- Motto: "Krinvanto Vishwam Aryam" "Let us ennoble the world"
- Ten Principles: Promoting truth-seeking, universalism, and ethical living



Gogabeel Lake Declared Newest Ramsar Site


- Gogabeel Lake, located in the Katihar district of Bihar, has been officially designated a Ramsar site, gaining global recognition as a wetland of international importance.
- With this, India adds yet another name to its growing list of protected wetlands under the Ramsar Convention, strengthening its commitment to wetland conservation and biodiversity protection.
- Situated in the trans-Gangetic plains, Gogabeel is a unique ox-bow lake—a
 naturally formed wetland created by the meandering course of rivers.
- Geographical highlights,
- Flanked by River Mahananda in the northeast and River Ganga in the south
- Lies in the Katihar district of Bihar
- First declared as Bihar's Community Reserve, reflecting strong community involvement in its preservation



Vande Mataram 150 Years Celebration


- 150 Years of Vande Mataram is a national commemorative initiative to celebrate the spirit of Vande Mataram and it's unique role in the history of India.
- On 1st October the Cabinet approved country-wide celebrations for the 150th anniversary of 'Vande Mataram' to foster an impactful movement to connect citizens, especially our youth and students with the song's original, revolutionary spirit.
- Bankim Chandra Chatterjee was born on June 26, 1838, in Kanthalpara village, located in Naihati, West Bengal. He came from a traditional Bengali Brahmin family. His father, Yadav Chandra Chattopadhyay, was a government official who later became the Deputy Collector of Midnapur.
- Some of his most famous novels include:
- Kapalkundala (1866)
- Vishabriksha (The Poison Tree) (1873)
- Anandamath (1882)
- Devi Chaudhurani (1884)
- Sitaram (1887)
- One of Bankim Chandra's greatest contributions to India was the creation of "Vande Mataram," written in Sanskritised Bengali. The song appears in his

novel "Anandamath" (1882), which depicts a group of monks fighting for India's freedom.



Guru Nanak Jayanti 2025

- Guru Nanak Jayanti, also known as Gurpurab, is a sacred festival that celebrates the birth of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the first Sikh Guru and founder of Sikhism. It is a day of devotion, peace, and unity, reminding people of Guru Nanak's teachings about truth, equality, and kindness. The festival inspires everyone to live with honesty, compassion, and faith in God.
- Guru Nanak Jayanti is more than just a festival it's a spiritual reminder of how one person's message can transform the world. Guru Nanak Dev Ji was born in 1469 at Talwandi (now Nankana Sahib in Pakistan). His teachings emphasized that God is One (Ik Onkar) and that all humans are equal, regardless of religion, gender, or status.
- He encouraged people to:
- Earn an honest living (Kirat Karni)
- Share with others (Vand Chakna)
- Remember God in all actions (Naam Japna)



Sir David Beckham Received Knighthood Honour

- Surrounded by his wife Victoria Beckham, who designed his suit for the occasion, and his parents, Beckham received the honour in an emotional ceremony.




QS Asia Rankings 2026

 The QS Asia University Rankings 2026 reveal a sobering trend for India's premier institutions: even as scores improve, rankings have declined—a signal of intensifying regional competition. Among the top 10 Indian universities, nine dropped in rank, with several IITs hitting their lowest positions in years. The setback comes as institutions in China, Singapore, South Korea, and Malaysia accelerate ahead, driven by globalisation, better research performance, and superior faculty-student ratios.

India Gears Up for 2026 Tiger Census

- India is preparing for the 2026 All India Tiger Estimation (AITE) the world's
 largest and most sophisticated wildlife survey. With India home to over 75% of
 the global wild tiger population, the AITE goes far beyond tiger counts.
- Building upon the 2022 survey that recorded 3,682 tigers, the upcoming census aims to deploy cutting-edge technology alongside traditional fieldwork, setting a global benchmark for conservation science.

Karnataka Becomes India's First State with Paid Menstrual Leave

- In a landmark decision promoting gender equality and workplace inclusivity,
 Karnataka has become the first state in India to approve 12 days of paid menstrual leave annually for women employees.
- This progressive policy, applicable to both government and private sectors, grants one day of leave per month to support women's health, dignity, and productivity in the workplace.
- Under the new guidelines, all female employees across Karnataka including those in the private sector — will be eligible for one paid day of leave each month due to menstruation-related discomfort or health challenges. This totals 12 additional paid leave days per year.



Bangladesh Becomes First Nation to Join UN Water Convention


- In a landmark move, Bangladesh has officially acceded to the UN Water Convention in 2025, becoming the first South Asian country to do so.
- This decision signals a significant shift in the region's approach to transboundary
 water governance and could impact existing bilateral water-sharing dynamics,
 particularly with India. As global water stress intensifies, Bangladesh's accession
 represents a strategic step to secure its interests through a multilateral legal
 framework.
- Bangladesh shares 54 rivers with India, including the Teesta and Ganga, which
 are vital for its agriculture, drinking water, and ecosystem sustainability.

- India has not joined the UN Water Convention. It continues to rely on bilateral treaties like,
- Indus Waters Treaty (1960) with Pakistan
- Ganga Water Sharing Treaty (1996) with Bangladesh



David Szalay Wins the 2025 Booker Prize for Flesh

- In a landmark literary moment, David Szalay, the Hungarian-British author known for his piercing explorations of modern existence, has won the 2025 Booker Prize for his sixth novel, Flesh.
- The announcement was made at a glittering ceremony at Old Billingsgate in London, where Szalay received the prestigious £50,000 prize and the Booker trophy from last year's winner, Samantha Harvey.
- The judges hailed Flesh as "a hypnotically tense and compelling novel that becomes an astonishingly moving portrait of a man's life." With this win, Szalay becomes the first author of Hungarian heritage to clinch the coveted prize.



India Achieves Historic Decline in TB Cases

- In a major public health achievement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has lauded India's unprecedented success in combating tuberculosis (TB) following the release of the WHO Global TB Report 2025.
- The report shows that India's TB incidence dropped by 21%—from 237 per lakh population in 2015 to 187 per lakh in 2024, almost double the global rate of decline (12%). Calling it a "remarkable momentum," PM Modi highlighted the significance of this achievement in realizing the vision of a TB-Mukt Bharat.
- India now hosts the world's largest TB lab network, featuring,
- 9,391 molecular testing centres
- 107 culture and drug susceptibility testing labs
- Over 500 Al-based portable X-ray units deployed nationwide, with 1,500 more on the way
- Services decentralized through 1.78 lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, making TB care more accessible



Birsa Munda Jayanti 2025

- Birsa Munda Jayanti is observed every year to remember one of India's greatest tribal leaders and freedom fighters. In 2025, this day becomes even more special because it marks an important milestone in his life and legacy.
- The celebration highlights his fight for tribal rights, protection of land, and upliftment of his community. Across the country, people come together to honour his courage, dedication, and lasting impact on India's history.
- Birsa Munda Jayanti 2025 is celebrated on 15 November to honour the birth anniversary of Birsa Munda, a legendary tribal freedom fighter and social reformer. The 2025 celebration is very special as it marks his 150th birth anniversary.
- The year 2025 marks the 150th birth anniversary of Birsa Munda. To honour this historic occasion, the government has been observing Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh, a year-long celebration of tribal heritage.



Jharkhand Foundation Day

- Jharkhand was formed on **November 15, 2000**. The Bihar Reorganization Act established Bihar as the **28th state of India**.
- The demand for a separate state had been a long-standing one, rooted in protecting the tribal population's rights and identity in the Chota Nagpur Plateau and Santhal Pargana regions.
- Movements led by organisations such as the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) gained momentum post-independence, calling for socio-economic development and self-governance. The state's creation under the Bihar Reorganisation Act, 2000, marked the fulfilment of a decades-long struggle for recognition and representation.



Jadeja Becomes 4th Cricketer in History to Achieve This

- In a historic moment for Indian cricket, Ravindra Jadeja has become only the fourth player in Test cricket history to achieve the rare double of 4000 runs and 300 wickets. The feat places him alongside legends like Kapil Dev, Ian Botham, and Daniel Vettori, reaffirming his legacy as one of the game's greatest allrounders.

UK Named Country Partner for Hornbill Festival 2025


 In a move that strengthens international cultural ties and boosts tourism in Northeast India, the United Kingdom has been officially named as the Country

Global Climate Change Performance Index 2026

- India has seen a significant drop in its climate performance ranking, falling 13 places to 23rd position in the Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI) 2026, released during the UN COP30 Climate Summit in Belém, Brazil.
- The report, jointly prepared by German Watch, New Climate Institute, and the Climate Action Network, highlights India's lack of a national coal exit timeline as a major factor behind the downgrade.

53rd Chief Justice of India

On November 24, 2025, Justice Surya Kant officially assumed office as the 53rd Chief Justice of India (CJI) after being administered the oath by President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan. His appointment marks a significant moment for the Indian judiciary, as he brings decades of legal experience and a strong track record of involvement in landmark judgments. His tenure as CJI will run until February 9, 2027, giving him a little over a year to lead the Supreme Court.



ICC T20 World Cup 2026

The ICC T20 World Cup 2026 is set to bring cricket fever back to South Asia.
 Scheduled from February 6 to March 8, 2026, this edition will be co-hosted by

India and Sri Lanka, marking a landmark collaboration between two cricket-loving nations.

- After the 2024 T20 World Cup in the West Indies and USA, the upcoming ICC T20 tournament promises even greater excitement, fresh talent, and world-class cricketing action.
- According to the ICC T20 World Cup 2026 schedule, the tournament will begin on February 6, 2026, and conclude with the final on March 8, 2026.
- While the venue for the final match has not yet been officially announced, early reports suggest that Colombo (Sri Lanka) or Ahmedabad (India) are the frontrunners. The choice will depend on the final qualification scenario, as Pakistan may not play matches in India due to bilateral conditions.



Italy Clinches Fourth Davis Cup Title

- In a historic moment for Italian tennis, Italy secured its fourth Davis Cup title by defeating Spain 2-0 in the final, marking its third consecutive championship victory. - India put up a commendable performance, finishing third in the overall medal tally with a total of 13 medals 3 gold, 6 silver, and 4 bronze. This marked a significant rise in India's stature in global shooting competitions.
- The gold medals for India came from Samrat Rana in the Men's 10m Air Pistol, Ravinder Singh in the Men's 50m Standard Pistol, and the Men's 10m Air Pistol Team.
- Bronze medals for India were earned by Esha Singh again in her individual 10m air pistol event, Elavenil Valarivan in the 10m Air Rifle, Varun Tomar in the 10m Air Pistol, and the Women's 10m Air Rifle Team.
- Among the silver medalists, Anish Bhanwala stood out for his performance in the Men's 25m Rapid Fire Pistol, where he scored 28 hits in the final and became the first Indian individual pistol shooter to win a medal in an Olympic event at the ISSF World Championships.
- China topped the medal table with 21 medals, including 12 golds, followed by South Korea with 14 medals, of which 7 were gold, and India stood third with 13. Notably, Switzerland and Norway followed close behind, finishing fourth and fifth respectively.



Ahmedabad Officially Secures 2030 Commonwealth Games Hosting

 Ahmedabad has been confirmed as the host city for the 2030 Commonwealth Games, positioning India once again at the center of a major global sporting spectacle.

- With the scars of the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games still fresh in global memory, Indian officials have been emphatic in assuring the world that this time will be different.
- The decision was finalized at the Commonwealth Sport's General Assembly in Glasgow on November 26, 2025, with Ahmedabad's bid edging out Nigeria's Abuja.

- The International Cricket Council (ICC) regularly updates its player rankings to evaluate performances across all formats — Tests, ODIs, and T20Is. These ICC rankings reflect a player's consistency, form, and overall contribution to matches over time.
- In the latest ICC Men's ODI Rankings (October 2025), India's captain Rohit Sharma climbed to the No. 1 position for the first time in his illustrious career. This remarkable achievement highlights his longevity, consistency, and world-class batting form in 2025.



Jakarta Becomes World's Most Populous City

- Jakarta has officially overtaken Tokyo to become the world's most populous city, according to the United Nations' World Urbanisation Prospects 2025 report.
 With an estimated population of 42 million, the Indonesian capital now leads a list dominated by rapidly expanding Asian megacities.
- This shift comes as a result of the UN's updated criteria, which aim to provide a
 more standardised and globally comparable framework for defining and
 measuring urban populations.

- The shift in rankings is attributed to revised urban delimitation criteria by the UN's Department of Economic and Social Affairs. Earlier assessments were based on varying national definitions of city boundaries, often favouring cities like Tokyo with expansive administrative coverage.
- Despite dropping in the global rankings, Tokyo remains a major metropolitan hub. Its 33 million residents are spread across the Greater Tokyo Area, which includes Saitama, Chiba, and Kanagawa prefectures the latter being home to Yokohama (population: 3.7 million).
