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Indian Navy to Commission INAS 335 (Ospreys)

- The Indian Navy will commission its second MH 60R helicopter squadron, INAS 335 (Ospreys), on December 17 at INS Hansa, Goa, in the presence of Adm Dinesh K Tripathi, the Chief of the Naval Staff.
- The occasion will mark a pivotal moment in the Indian Navy's continued efforts towards modernisation and capability enhancement.
- The advanced weapons, sensors and avionics suite make the helicopter a
 versatile and capable asset for the Indian Navy, offering enhanced capabilities to
 address conventional as well as asymmetric threats, the release stated.
- The aircraft has been fully integrated with fleet operations and has proven its worth on numerous occasions. The Indian Navy will receive a significant fillip in its integral aviation capabilities with the commissioning of the squadron.
- Meanwhile, the Indian Navy is set to commission DSC A20, the first vessel of the indigenously designed and constructed Diving Support Craft (DSC), at Kochi on December 16 (Tuesday), under the aegis of Southern Naval Command.
- DSC A20 is the lead ship in a series of five Diving Support Craft being built by
 M/s Titagarh Rail Systems Limited (TRSL), Kolkata.



Sagar Defence to Establish Autonomous Maritime Shipyard

- The Andhra Pradesh government has approved a proposal by Sagar Defence Engineering Pvt Ltd to establish India's "first" dedicated autonomous maritime shipyard and systems development centre in Nellore district.
- The proposed project, which will come up at Juvvaladinne Fishing Harbour, is aimed at positioning the state as a key hub for next-generation maritime and autonomous systems development.
- The project is expected to generate employment for around 750 people, including 300 direct and 450 indirect jobs, while strengthening the coastal industrial and skills ecosystem, it said.



Army Places Orders Worth Rs 5,000 Crore

- FThe Army is placing a series of orders for indigenous drones capable of operating in spoofing and jamming environments after conducting rigorous trials that recreated conditions faced on the Op Sindoor battlefield.
- Orders worth over ₹5,000 crore are being placed on domestic companies for a range of unmanned systems-for short-range kamikaze strikes role to longerrange precise munition delivery as well as reconnaissance-after a three-tiered selection process that included mandatory screening for Chinese-origin parts.
- The drones are being bought using emergency procurement powers that have been granted to the Army after Op Sindoor. Sources said that a primary objective of the selection process was to identify drones that are capable of operating in heavy jamming and spoofing environments, as faced during Op Sindoor.
- In what came as a surprise to several contenders, Munitions India Limited emerged strong in the competition, winning contracts worth close to ₹500 crore for loitering munitions. This is the first such major order placed on a public sector unit.
- In the private sector, a major chunk went to New Space Research &
 Technologies and SMPP Pvt Ltd, which teamed up to offer surveillance and
 Kamikaze strike drones, bagging orders worth close to ₹725 crore. This places
 the combine as a major player in the military drones sector.



VAYUVYA Defence Building GARUDA MK-1

 (LoC) with Pakistan.
- The airframe of the Garuda MK-1 stands out for its lightweight composite construction, primarily utilising advanced carbon fibre reinforced polymers (CFRP) and other high-strength, low-weight materials.
- This design choice enables superior aerodynamic efficiency, allowing the UAV to achieve endurance flights exceeding 24 hours while maintaining altitudes between 15,000 and 25,000 feet.
