India Unveils Logo and Website for BRICS

- India has officially begun preparations for its **BRICS Presidency in 2026** by unveiling the logo and dedicated website for the grouping. The launch signals India's vision for a people-centric and inclusive chairship at a time of growing global uncertainty.
- India launched the official logo and website for BRICS Presidency 2026. The announcement was made by S. Jaishankar, marking the formal start of India's preparations to assume the BRICS chairship.
- India's BRICS Presidency theme is "**Building for Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation and Sustainability.**"
- The newly launched BRICS India website will act as a central digital platform during India's chairship. It will provide information on meetings, initiatives and outcomes, ensuring transparency and wider engagement.
- BRICS is a grouping of major emerging economies formed in 2006. It serves as a platform for cooperation on economic, political and development issues, representing the interests of the Global South in global governance.



Jio to Launch People-First AI Platform

- Mukesh Ambani announced Jio's people-first AI platform. The announcement was made at the Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conference in Rajkot.
- Mukesh Ambani said the upcoming AI platform will be built in India, for India, and the world. It will allow citizens to use AI services daily in their own language and on their personal devices.
- To support this vision, Jio is building India's largest AI-ready data centre in **Jamnagar**. Ambani stated that Reliance aims to make Gujarat India's artificial intelligence pioneer.
- The AI platform is part of Reliance's broader commitment to Gujarat, which includes a **₹7 lakh crore** investment over five years, leadership in clean energy, and expansion in digital services.




YUVA AI for All

- The primary objective of CSPOC is to strengthen parliamentary institutions and enhance understanding of parliamentary democracy in its diverse forms.
- A key theme will be the **use of Artificial Intelligence in Parliament, examining how AI can improve legislative efficiency, transparency and research support.**

- Lohri is celebrated every year on 13 January, a day before Makar Sankranti. In 2026, Lohri will be observed on Tuesday, 13 January 2026, symbolizing the Sun's northward movement and the gradual transition from winter to spring.
- Lohri is a harvest festival linked to the agrarian traditions of North India. It celebrates the harvesting of rabi crops such as wheat, sugarcane, and mustard. People thank nature, the Sun, and the earth for agricultural prosperity and pray for abundance in the coming year. The festival also represents hope, warmth, and positive beginnings.



India Joins G7 Critical Minerals

- India has entered high-level discussions on critical minerals in Washington, signaling a deeper alignment with the US and G7 economies as they seek to reduce dependence on China-dominated supply chains.

- Minister for Electronics and Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw arrived in Washington DC on Sunday to participate in a critical minerals ministerial meeting hosted by US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent.
- The meeting is being held on the sidelines of a gathering of finance ministers from the Group of Seven, which includes Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the UK and the US, along with the European Union. India and Australia have also been invited.
- “Arrived in Washington, DC. Will participate in the Critical Minerals Ministerial Meeting tomorrow. Secure critical mineral supply chains are vital for our goal of Viksit Bharat,” Vaishnaw said in a social media post.
- According to the International Energy Agency, China is the world’s leading refiner for most major critical minerals, including copper, lithium, nickel, cobalt, graphite and rare earth elements, with an average market share of around 70 percent
- The agency has also flagged China’s control over downstream components such as manganese sulphate and phosphoric acid, key inputs for batteries and advanced manufacturing.
- This concentration has become a strategic vulnerability for Western economies, particularly as demand for minerals accelerates with the energy transition and AI-led data centre expansion.
