### National Girl Child Day 2026

- National Girl Child Day 2026 will be observed across India on Saturday, 24 January. The day is dedicated to raising awareness about the rights of the girl child and addressing the challenges faced by girls in Indian society. It also highlights the importance of gender equality and the need to create a safe, supportive, and empowering environment for every girl.
- The Government of India began observing National Girl Child Day in 2008 under the Ministry of Women and Child Development. The initiative was launched in response to concerns such as declining child sex ratio, gender-based discrimination, limited access to education, early marriage, and health-related inequalities affecting girls.
- The primary objective of National Girl Child Day is to promote positive societal attitudes toward girls and to spread awareness about government schemes aimed at their welfare. 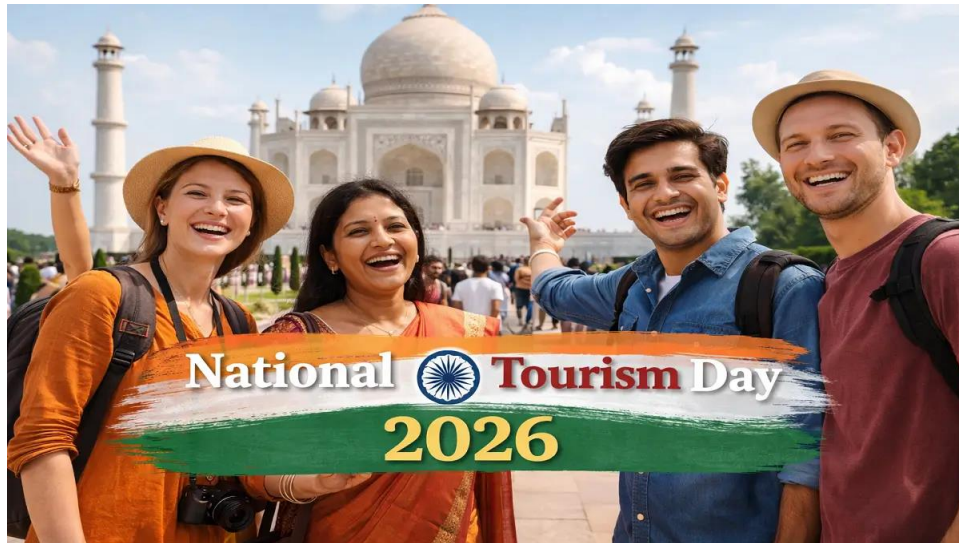
## National Voters Day 2026

- National Voters Day is observed every year on **January 25** across India. In 2026, the day will fall on Sunday, January 25. The date is significant because it marks the foundation day of the **Election Commission of India (ECI)**, the constitutional body responsible for conducting free and fair elections in the country.
- National Voters Day was first celebrated in 2011. The Government of India decided to observe this day to increase awareness about the importance of electoral participation and to encourage more citizens to register as voters.
- The day commemorates the establishment of the Election Commission of India on January 25, 1950, just one day before India became a Republic. Since then, the Election Commission has played a crucial role in maintaining the integrity and transparency of elections in the world's largest democracy.

## Uttar Pradesh Statehood Day

- The Prime Minister, Narendra Modi extended warm greetings to all the people of Uttar Pradesh on the occasion of the state's Establishment Day, lauding their invaluable contribution to the richness of India's culture and heritage.
- The theme for Uttar Pradesh Foundation Day 2025 is "**Development and Heritage: Uttar Pradesh on the Path to Progress**".
- The state government will confer the '**Uttar Pradesh Gaurav Samman**' award on six individuals from the fields of music, agriculture and education during the state foundation day.
- Uttar Pradesh, formerly known as United Provinces, was renamed on 24 January, 1950, by the governor general of India through the United Provinces (Alteration of Name) Order, 1950.
- The state began celebrating 24 January as UP Foundation Day in 2018, following a suggestion by governor Ram Naik.





## Uttarakhand Signs MoU with ITBP

- The Uttarakhand government has taken an important step to strengthen healthcare facilities in border areas. On Thursday, the state government signed a MoU with the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) under a new initiative called **'Swasth Seema Abhiyan'**.
- The agreement aims to provide better medical services to people living in remote border villages.
- Under the Swasth Seema Abhiyan, integrated primary healthcare services will be provided to 108 border villages located in Pithoragarh, Chamoli and Uttarkashi districts. These villages are located in difficult and hard-to-reach areas. The programme will be rolled out in phases, starting with the most remote locations.
